Read: Psalm 19:7–11

1. What words are used that refer to God’s written word?

2. What descriptive words (adjectives) are associated with each reference to God’s Word?

3. What do verses 1–6 have to do with verses 7–11?

4. What do verses 12–14 have to do with verses 7–11?

5. Discussion/Application: What is the main idea of Psalm 19?

Wednesday, December 30

Read: Psalm 119:1–44

1. What are your five favorite Bible synonyms found in these verses? (Every verse contains a synonym.)

2. Looking back over your choices, what action is expected from a believer in relation to God’s Word? (What are we supposed to do?)

3. What outcome can we expect if we do what those verses say we are supposed to do?

4. Do any of your selected verses mention the impact on other peoples’ lives because of your commitment to God’s Word? If so, what is the impact?

5. Discussion/Application: Choose one of the five verses and list at least two ways you can do what that verse says.

Thursday, December 31

Read: Psalm 119:45–88

1. What are your five favorite Bible synonyms found in these verses?

2. Looking back over your choices, what action is expected from a believer in relation to God's Word? (What are we supposed to do?)

3. What outcome can we expect if we do what those verses say we are supposed to do?

4. Do any of your selected verses mention the impact on other peoples' lives because of your commitment to God's Word? If so, what is the impact?

5. Discussion/Application: Choose one of the five verses and list at least two ways you can do what that verse says.

Friday, January 1 (Happy New Year!)

Read: Psalm 119:89–132
